## Not-for-Profits Programme Applications – Case Studies

## **ARTS ORGANISATIONS**

## Example 1 - Application accepted

 This organisation is a charitable incorporated organisation (CIO) which, while renting out some studio space commercially to local artists, reinvests 100% of that money into its free activities offered to the local community. ✓

CIOs are an example of the not-for-profit structures that LawWorks can assist and the CIO confirmed that any profits are reinvested into assisting vulnerable and disadvantaged people.

 The CIO's main service users are locals – it is located in an area that is in the 10% most deprived areas in England, according to the Index of Multiple Deprivation, meaning that the people using the facility are likely to be vulnerable and/or disadvantaged. ✓

The CIO provided valid information that confirmed its service users were located in areas of deprivation and they were therefore likely to be vulnerable and disadvantaged.

Additionally, the CIO specifically caters to artists with special needs or disabilities
with free services for those artists; it has an outreach programme that engages
schoolchildren in schools specifically in areas of deprivation; and it has
addressed inequality in the arts by offering locals a free space to hold art
workshops or exhibitions. ✓

The CIO also helps people with disabilities – a group LawWorks categorises as "vulnerable and disadvantaged" in its <u>eligibility criteria</u>.

## Example 2 – Application rejected

• This organisation is a CIO which hosts a range of arts events throughout the year. It is committed to working in an eco-friendly manner. ✓

CIOs are an example of the not-for-profit structures that LawWorks can assist and the CIO confirmed that any profits are reinvested into the programme.

 The CIO's main service users are the paying event attendees, and overall the purpose of the organisation is to put on eco-art-themed events. X

The charity's beneficiaries are not "vulnerable and disadvantaged" as defined in LawWorks' <u>eligibility criteria</u>. The purpose of the CIO is to run events; although the events are run in an eco-friendly manner with a focus on raising environmental awareness and supporting the arts, this is still fundamentally a commercial undertaking.

Helping the environment does not automatically have a focus on helping vulnerable and disadvantaged people (although this is case specific).
