



Law School Challenge 2023-24

How to register

- 1. **One University: One Team.** There is no limit on the number of people or even a need to study law, so long as they are all from the same university. A university can have only one team, in the case of multiple registrations the teams will be asked to merge.
- Every team needs to have one academic contact, one team captain and vice-captain contact. Communications will be sent directly to these three. Appointing a Social Media Officer for your team is recommended but not compulsory.
- 3. Each team must **complete the** <u>online registration form</u> to complete the sign-up process. To register a team for the Law School Challenge you will need the following information.
 - A team name
 - A team captain (and their contact details)
 - A vice team captain (and their contact details)
 - An Academic contact (and their contact details)
 - Details/handles/names of any social media accounts that you will be using to support your activities in the challenge
- 4. Each team will need to register on our fundraising platform (Enthuse) and send us the link to your page before you may begin competing. Instructions explaining how to do this will be sent out **after** you have completed the registration.
- 5. Teams are free to register any time before the Challenge closes at the end of March 2024. However, it is most likely the team that has held multiple events over the course of the Challenge will be victorious, so we do encourage you to join as soon as possible.

What does the Challenge involve?

- The aim of the Challenge is to raise funds for both our organisations and therefore fund the facilitation of free legal advice and simultaneously raise awareness of the services available.
- Develop and hone your fundraising and organisational skills. Fundraising activities can take any form and given the focus of our charities would be looked on positively by future employers.
- Each team must adhere to the fundraising guidance and rules set out by the <u>Institute of Fundraising</u>.
- The final decision will be determined by both Advocate and LawWorks and this decision is absolute and final. There will be no appeals.
- Any event that you decide to do you must remain respectful at all times as you have the reputation of our charities and your universities/institutions to represent.
